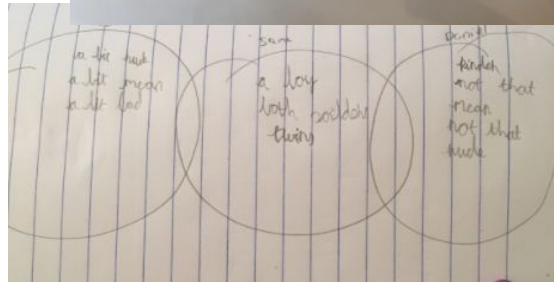
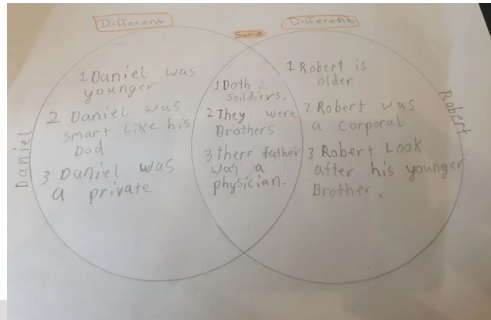
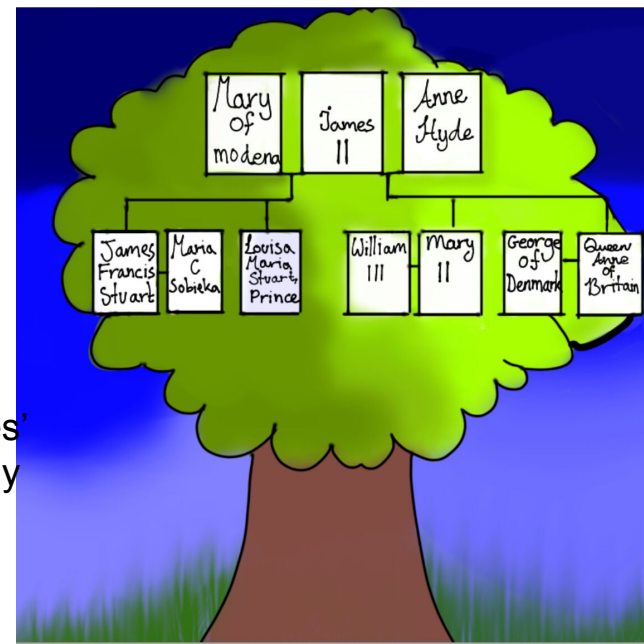

King James' Family Tree

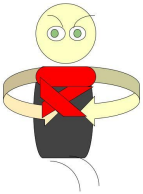
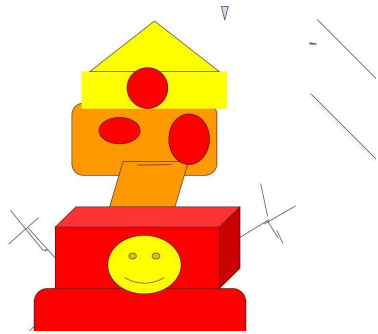

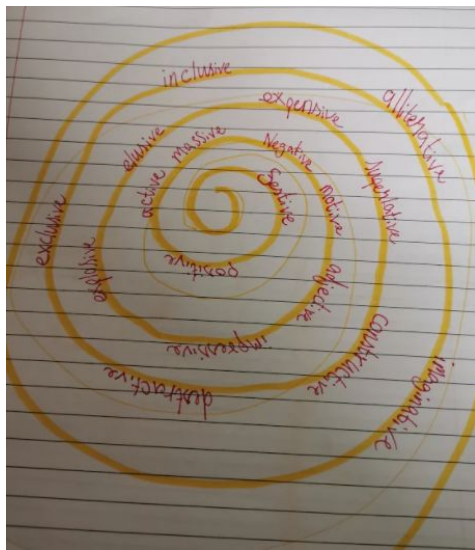
Drogheda was a small walled town it was over crowded the noise was incredible thanks screaming children, lowing cattle and barking dogs.

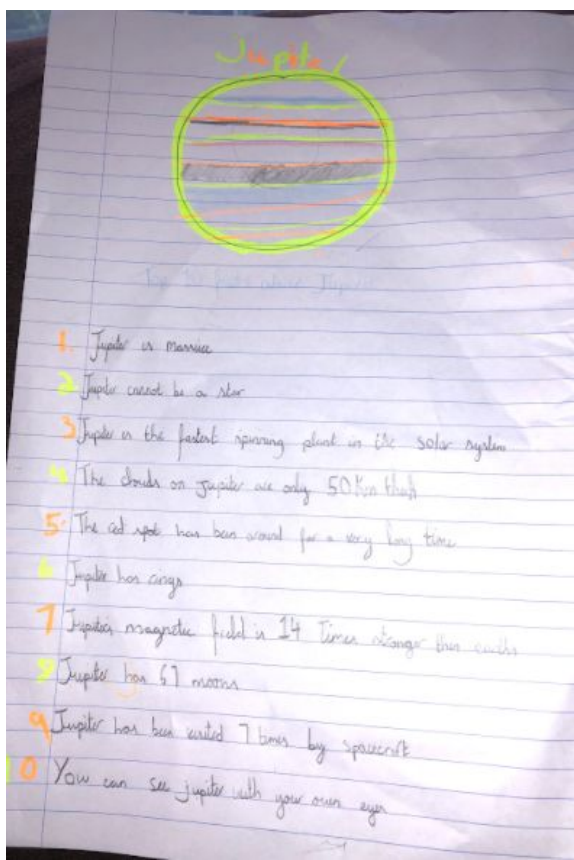




Creative writing and being an “Artful Artist” after reading
